What is this course about?

This popular course is ideal for beginners or repeat attendees. In Relief Printmaking Part 2, students will be carving Japanese plywood plates to create a multi-plate print edition. Relief printing focuses on form and texture; you will learn to combine the tone, hue and saturation of multiple colours to achieve an edition of prints on archival Italian paper. The course fee covers materials including a set of Japanese woodcut tools if you sign up to the full ten weeks in order to continue working on the plates outside of teaching hours.

Open Access runs on Thursday evening and Saturday during the day, giving you the opportunity to further develop your printmaking skills.

There is a maximum of ten students per course guided by one to one tutoring from an experienced printmaker.

The studio is a low-toxic environment with dedicated printmaking facilities for professional hands-on learning. Students benefit from the diversity of attendees, taught by internationally renowned printmaking artists at a central location, offering a unique educational experience in London.

By the end of this course:

You will be self led and have gained experience to continue developing your relief printing skills during Open Access on Thursday evenings or Saturday daytime.

About your tutor

Theo Ereira-Guyer has an MA in Printmaking from the Royal College of Art and has exhibited in galleries in London and Hong Kong and has work in the collections at the British Museum and the V&A. Awards include the Helen Chadwick Award and the Royal College of Art's WIP Prize.

What level is the course and do I need any particular skills?

Ideal for complete beginners, for repeat attendees, for those requiring a refresher course or who have previously completed a Printmaking Taster Weekend.

How will I be taught, and what feedback and support will I get?

Your experienced tutor will support you throughout the course in both group sessions and one-to-one support providing daily feedback, critique and constructive advice. Each course ends in a final round up session and should you wish for any specific feedback or support, please speak with your tutor at the start of your course.

When I've finished, what course can I do next?

There are a variety of courses available as short courses over the Easter and the Summer holidays, also a range of evening classes in Printmaking as well as drawing, painting and sculpture.

A rolling programme of specialist Printmaking courses takes place on Tuesday and Wednesday evenings and visiting printmakers facilitate specialist courses on weekends throughout the year. Open Access with supervision takes place on Thursday evening or Saturday daytime. Monthly Access is available for attendees with competent printmaking experience.

If you have more time available huge development can be made in your practice by attending one of our part time day classes in printmaking or the printmaking certificate programme. Please see all the options available on our web site.

Weekly breakdown

Courses at the Art Academy offer a structured approach to ensure specific subjects, skills and methods are covered. Below is a weekly breakdown of what will be covered. Bear in mind that these classes will move with the pace of the class so a degree of flexibility of what will be covered on which day will be employed.

1	Draw your composition onto the keyblock plate and cut the first plywood plate with Japanese woodcut tools	Print studio	Sketch books, photographs, books - visual imagery in general to work from
2	Print the keyblock plate onto a second plate to cut.	Print studio	Tutor will advise ahead of class
3	Proof the two plates on the press with different colour combinations	Print studio	Tutor will advise ahead of class
4	Print the keyblock plate on a third plate to cut.	Print studio	Tutor will advise ahead of class

5	Edition the three plates on the press.	Print studio	Tutor will advise ahead of class

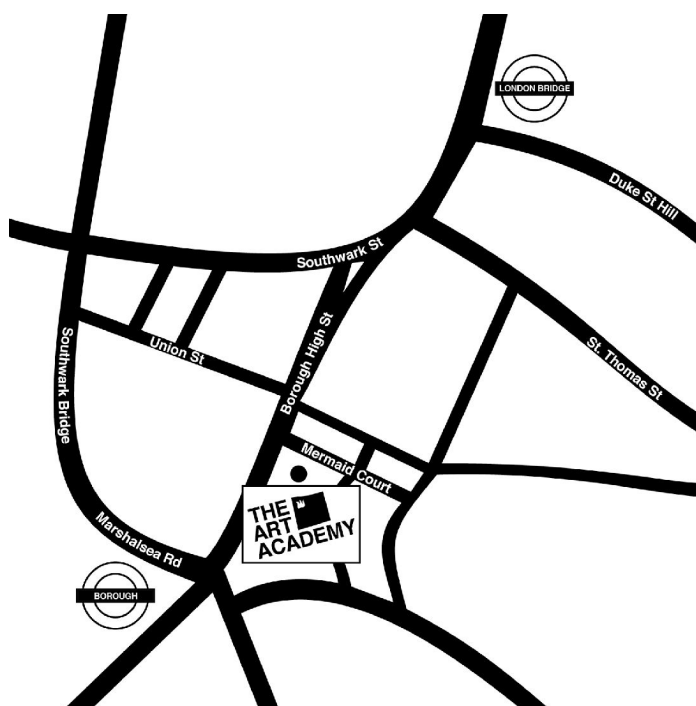
Location
