What is this course about?

This specialist course is ideal for beginners, repeat attendees or visitors to London. Working with two different relief techniques, you will produce both a reduction linocut and multi-block woodcut. Attendees will learn to carve with Japanese woodcut tools, mix oil-based inks and print in register onto archival paper. The course will be guided by one-to-one tuition from Victoria Browne, the Associate Professor of Printmaking and Drawing, Kunsthøgskolen, Oslo and founder of Kaleid Editions.

Open Access runs on Thursday evening and Saturday during the day, giving you the opportunity to further develop your printmaking skills. There is a maximum of ten students per course guided by one to one tutoring from Victoria Browne, with ten years printmaking experience.

The Art Academy's printmaking studio is a low-toxic environment with dedicated facilities for professional hands-on learning. Students benefit from the diversity of attendees, taught by internationally renowned printmaker artists at a central location, offering a unique educational experience in London. There is a maximum of eight to ten students per course, materials are included and we advise that you book early to avoid disappointment.

By the end of this course:

You will have gained experience to continue developing your skills on a specialist course held on evenings or weekends.

About your tutor

Victoria Browne draws on public special collections to appropriate material research, applying traditional and innovative print techniques in the development of site responsive installations. As the Founder of Kaleid Editions her practice extends to artists' books in addition to curating and representing European based artists. She is the Associate Professor of Printmaking and Drawing at Oslo National Academy of the Arts (Kunstogskolen | Oslo), Norway, and a visiting lecturer in the UK . Browne's work is held in public collections at the Tate, V&A Museum, Bristol City Museum and Bergen Council. In 2011 and 2012 she received the Birgit Skiöld Memorial Trust Award for Excellence.

What level is the course and do I need any particular skills?

The Relief Weekend is very attractive to complete beginners or attendees requiring a refresher course. In order to benefit from Open Access at AAP studio, beginners must complete a taster and a specialist printmaking course or provide the equivalent evidence as a portfolio of prints.

How will I be taught, and what feedback and support will I get?

Your experienced tutor will support you throughout the course in both group sessions and one-to-one support providing daily feedback, critique and constructive advice. Each course ends in a final round up session and should you wish for any specific feedback or support, please speak with your tutor at the start of your course.

Are there any other costs? What else should I bring?

Material costs are included in your course fee. Students should bring ideas, sketchbooks, writing & drawing tools.

When I've finished, what course can I do next?

A rolling programme of specialist courses takes place on evenings and international visiting printmakers facilitate master courses on weekends throughout the year.

Weekly breakdown

Courses at the Art Academy offer a structured approach to ensure specific subjects, skills and methods are covered. Below is a weekly breakdown of what will be covered. Bear in mind that these classes will move with the pace of the class so a degree of flexibility of what will be covered on which day will be employed.

Weeknd	Topic/skills covered
Sat 03 Dec	Introduction to relief printmaking techniques with lino, followed by a demonstration of cutting, inking and printing. Each student will complete a series of reduction linoleum prints with one-to-one guidance from Victoria.
Sun 04 Dec	Introduction to relief printmaking techniques with wood, followed by a demonstration of cutting, inking and printing. Each student will complete a series of multiplate woodcut prints with one-to-one guidance from Victoria.
