What is this course about?

This is a well-structured and systematic course for those who have never painted before or would like to reassess their approach to painting. Students learn to see colour, shape and tone, and to relate these elements together in compositions. This course aims to foster self-confidence and enjoyment of painting in a stimulating environment. Working through a series of exercises, students gain experience and skills in working from a life model and from still life as well as exploring a more creative approach to painting, which helps to establish their own style and identity. A fun and relaxing experience that offers a high level of tutor contact time.

What topics do we cover?

- How to measure and get a sense of the whole.
- Exploration of mark making and line.
- An understanding of tonal painting.
- An understanding of how colour works.
- Experience in the use of acrylic paint.

By the end of this course you will: complete some paintings work but the emphasis is primarily on exploring technique.

About your tutor

Neil Morley graduated from the Royal College of Art in 2001 with an MA in Painting. Since then he has exhibited both nationally and internationally and has been a visiting painting lecturer at several UK universities. In 2009-10 he completed the highly prestigious Berwick Gymnasium Artist Fellowship. Neil is a painter with a strong interest in colour, composition and materials.

What level is the course and do I need any particular skills?

The course is for all levels, so no previous experience is necessary and is ideal for those who are looking to build confidence in their painting.

How will I be taught, and what feedback and support will I get?

Your experienced tutor will support you throughout the course in both group sessions and

one-to-one support providing daily feedback, critique and constructive advice. Each course ends in a final round up session and should you wish for any specific feedback or support, please speak with your tutor at the start of your course.

When I've finished, what course can I do next?

There are a variety of courses available as short courses over the Easter and the Summer holidays, also a wide range of evening classes, such as Creative Painting for Beginners, Intermediate Painting, Saturday Open Life Class, figure sculpture etc.

If you have more time available huge development can be made in your practice by attending one of our part time day classes in sculpture or the sculpture certificate programme. Please see all the options available on our web site.

Are there any other costs? What else should I bring each lesson?

An old shirt or apron would be advantageous.
 Students may bring their own paints and brushes if they wish.
 Students may bring in their own choices of objects for a still life on the first day.
 Students should bring a kitchen roll or a couple of rags and 2 clean jam jars.

- A set of bristle brushes, both flat and round, suitable for either oils or acrylics
- One tear off palette (9"x12")
- One palette knife
- Two 8"x10" canvas boards
- Three 10"x14" canvas boards
- 8 Daler Rowney acrylic tubes: black, white, cadmium red, ultramarine blue, yellow ochre, sap green, burnt umber, cadmium yellow


