What is this course about?

A wonderful opportunity for people with all levels of experience to explore and enhance their drawing and life drawing skills. Over this packed weekend, students work through a variety of themes to learn fundamental drawing skills, including measurement, drawing the figure, and tonal drawing. As well as developing observational drawing skills, students are encouraged to be creative and expressive and to try out new approaches such as exploring different drawing materials, and experimenting with line and contrast. This is an intensive, informative, and fun weekend course, which teaches essential drawing skills whilst encouraging a creative approach.

What topics do we cover?

- Measuring and mapping the figure
- Structure, tone, form & line
- Creative drawing techniques and testing materials

By the end of this course you will: build a body of drawings and life drawings, boosting your confidence through gaining or improving drawing skills.

What level is the course and do I need any particular skills?

This course is suitable for all levels and no previous drawing experience is required.

How will I be taught, and what feedback and support will I get?

Your experienced tutor will support you throughout the course in both group sessions and one-to-one support providing regular feedback, critique and constructive advice. Each course ends in a final round up session and should you wish for any specific feedback or support, please speak with your tutor at the start of your course.

When I've finished, what course can I do next?

There are a variety of courses available as short courses over the Summer holidays, also a wide range of evening classes, such as Drawing for Beginners, Intermediate Drawing, Life Drawing, and Introduction to Painting.

If you have more time available huge development can be made in your practice by attending one


