What is this course about?

This course is suitable for beginners and those with some printmaking experience. This two day course focuses on the European tradition of chiaroscuro, working with professional carving tools and oil-based inks to create and combine multiple coloured blocks in register onto archival quality paper. The course will be guided by one-to-one tuition from Theodore Ereira-Guyer RCA.

The Art Academy's printmaking studio is a low-toxic environment with dedicated facilities for professional hands-on learning. Students benefit from the diversity of attendees, taught by internationally renowned printmaker artists at a central location, offering a unique educational experience in London. There is a maximum of eight to ten students per course, materials are included and we advise that you book early to avoid disappointment.

By the end of this course:

You will be self led and have gained experience to continue developing your relief printing skills during Open Access on Thursday evenings or Saturday daytimes.

About your tutor

Theo Ereira-Guyer has an MA in Printmaking from the Royal College of Art and has exhibited in galleries in London and Hong Kong and has work in the collections at the British Museum and the V&A. Awards include the Helen Chadwick Award and the Royal College of Art's WIP Prize.

What level is the course and do I need any particular skills?

Ideal for complete beginners, for attendees requiring a refresher course or who have previously completed a Relief Printing evening course.

How will I be taught, and what feedback and support will I get?

Your experienced tutor will support you throughout the course in both group sessions and one-to-one support providing daily feedback, critique and constructive advice. Each course ends in a final round up session and should you wish for any specific feedback or support, please speak with your tutor at the start of your course.

Are there any other costs? What else should I bring?

Material costs are included in your course fee. Students should bring ideas, sketchbooks, writing & drawing tools.

When I've finished, what course can I do next?

A rolling programme of specialist courses takes place on Monday evenings and international visiting printmakers facilitate master courses on weekends throughout the year. Open Access with supervision takes place on Tuesday evening or Saturday daytime. Monthly Access is available for attendees with competent printmaking experience.

Weekly breakdown

Courses at the Art Academy offer a structured approach to ensure specific subjects, skills and methods are covered. Below is a weekly breakdown of what will be covered. Bear in mind that these classes will move with the pace of the class so a degree of flexibility of what will be covered on which day will be employed.

Day	Topic/skills covered
Sat 8 April	Theo will present the history of European multiplate woodcut, combined with demonstrations of hand-carving and printing with two blocks. Students will learn the camaieu woodcut technique that employs two or three tints of a single colour, to develop their personal projects.
Sun 9 April	Students will continue to improve their skills and complete an edition of woodcut prints with the support of one-to-one tutoring from Theo.

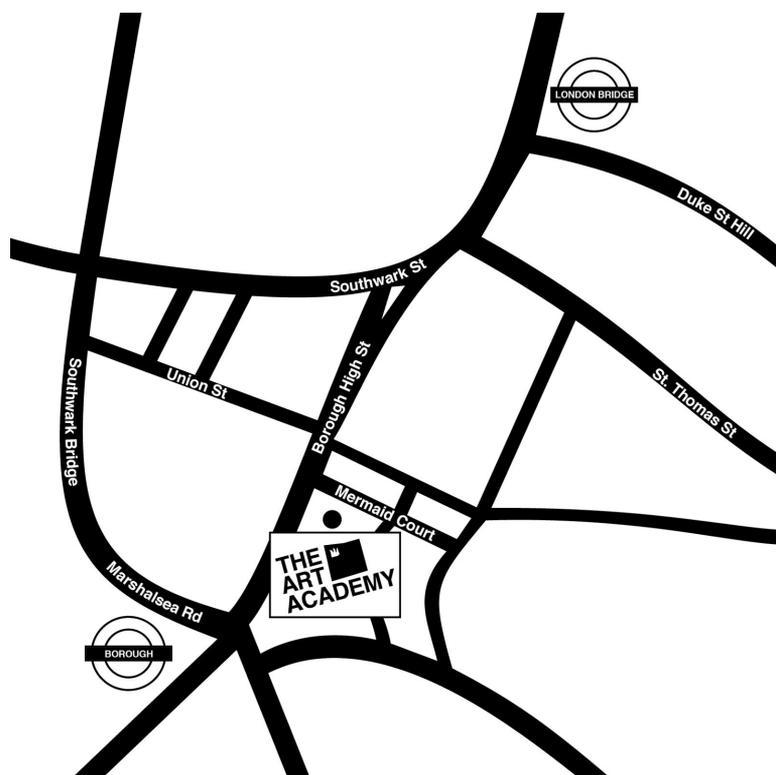
