What is this course about?

This course is suitable for beginners or those with printmaking experience. Nick Morley (aka "Linocut boy") specialises in hand carved linocuts. Students will learn to use professional swiss tools and apply different printing techniques to create a range of effects. Nick will lead the group through the planning, carving and printing stages of multiplate printing.

The studio is a low-toxic environment with dedicated printmaking facilities for professional hands-on learning. Students benefit from the diversity of attendees, taught by internationally renowned printmaking artists at a central location, offering a unique educational experience in London. There are a maximum of eight students per course, materials are included and we advise that you book early to avoid disappointment.

About your tutor

Nick Morley is an artist and illustrator based in Margate. His prints have been exhibited worldwide and have been featured on the BBC and in the Guardian and Telegraph magazines.

Nick's linocut illustrations have appeared on book and magazine covers. His clients include Penguin, Faber & Faber and ICON magazine. As well as making prints, Nick runs Hello Print Studio in Margate, writes a blog and is writing a linocut handbook for artists and designers.

Your experienced tutor will support you throughout the course in both group sessions and one-to-one support providing daily feedback, critique and constructive advice. The course is based on demonstrations, instruction and studio practice. Each course ends in a final round up session and should you wish for any specific feedback or support, please speak with your tutor at the start of your course.


