What is this course about?

An inspiring five day course for ages 15-17 providing a skills-based experience and expert tuition in a range of materials and techniques. The programme is taught by specialist tutors who are also professional, practicing artists. Access to portrait models and contemporary painting and sculpture techniques provides a unique opportunity to develop new skills. Students develop their painting style encompassing portraiture and mixed media abstraction, along with a day exploring kinetic sculpture.

This is an ideal course for those studying arts subjects who wish to develop course work, create new work for their portfolio, develop new techniques and skills, and further existing abilities in a professional art school environment.

What topics do we cover?

- recapping the fundamentals of painting such as tone and colour;
- developing a portrait painting, using two portrait models;
- in depth understanding of abstraction in painting using mixed media;
- exploring kinetic sculpture and concepts of motion and change in art;
- sculpting the figure in clay and plaster.

By the end of this course you will: have had an intensive week learning new skills and techniques, developed new work for portfolio, and experienced working in a focused art school environment

What level is the course and do I need any particular skills?

The course is structured for 16-18 year olds who are studying creative subjects and/or wish to learn new artistic skills.

How will I be taught, and what feedback and support will I get?

Your experienced tutor will support you throughout the course in both group sessions and one-to-one support providing daily feedback, critique and constructive advice. Each course ends in a final round up session and should you wish for any specific feedback or support, please speak with your tutor at the start of your course.

When I've finished, what course can I do next?

The Art Academy Foundation course is an ideal progression following the Fine Art Workshop.

There is also a wide range of weekend and evening classes, such as Painting for Beginners, Life Drawing, Creative Sculpture, and Saturday Drop in Life Class.

If you have more time available, huge development can be made in your practice by attending one of our part time day classes in painting, or our certificate programme. Please see all the options available on our web site.

Are there any other costs? What else should I bring each lesson?

Bellow is a list of materials you will need for the course, you can buy these easily from any high-street art shop:

- Willow charcoal
- Charcoal pencils
- Eraser
- Putty rubber
- Student level Oil Paints, Recommended colours: Titanium white, Cadmium Yellow, Lemon Yellow, Cadmium Red, Alizarin Crimson, French Ultramarine, Cerulean Blue, Burnt Umber.
- Pallet
- Brushes
- An off-set pallet knife
- A rag
- 2 medium canvases around 40cm in size

If you cannot get your own painting materials you can buy an **Oil Painting Pack** for £45 at the time of booking which will be available when you arrive for your first class.

An **Oil Painting Pack** contains:

A set of bristle brushes, both flat and round, suitable for either oils or acrylics.

One tear off palette (9"x12").

One palette knife.

Two 8"x10" canvas boards

Three 10"x14" canvas boards.

6 Daler Rowney oil tubes: Titanium white, cadmium yellow, cadmium red, alizarin crimson, French ultramarine and Burnt Umber.

Daily breakdown

Courses at the Art Academy offer a structured approach to ensure specific subjects, skills and methods are covered. Below is a daily breakdown of what will be covered. Bear in mind that these classes will move with the pace of the class so a degree of flexibility of what will be covered on which day will be employed.

1	31st July	<p>Painting the portrait Students will spend the morning revisiting the fundamentals of painting, such as colour, tone, and application. In the afternoon, students will begin a large portrait painting, working from a professional portrait model, and taking inspiration from contemporary artists. 4	3rd Aug	<p>Kinetic sculpture</p> <p>The day will start with an introductory discussion to kinetic sculpture, including artists who use kinetic elements in their work. Students will then work as a group to create their own kinetic piece, exploring concepts of motion and change, and using a wide range of materials including wire, fabric, and found objects objects.</p>	Studio 3	We will provide all the basic materials (calico, wire, stuffing etc) but students can bring any materials they may wish to include in their piece. 5	4th Aug	<p>Sculpture: Wire and Clay figure</p> <p>The last day of the course will be an intensive introduction to sculpting the life model. Students will learn fundamental anatomy, and work with mixed media materials to create a wire armature in the morning, before moving onto sculpting an abstracted seated figure in clay, using the forms of Henry Moore as inspiration.</p>	Studio 3	Materials will be provided	Yes


