What is this course about?

An fun and intensive week of life and portrait painting appropriate to all skill levels. Less experienced students will enjoy an introduction to portraiture and figure painting while more advanced students benefit from a refresher in figure work from an experienced artist which will progress their practice. The emphasis will be on learning practical skills as well as bringing out intuitive ability. The course will cover planning a painting and executing two types of portrait: head and shoulders and a full figure composition.

What topics do we cover?

- Practical use of paint, How to arrange your palette, colour mixing ideas, and understanding tone.
- Principles in drawing such as proportion and pictorial space
- Developing critical and visual awareness of the model and surroundings
- Students have the opportunity to complete a full figure painting and a portrait

By the end of this course students will have 3-4 completed paintings, including head and shoulders portrait and compositional full figure portrait within the studio.

About your tutor

James Bland is an English figurative artist and a member of the New English Art Club. Awards include Doreen McIntosh Prize 2015; 1st Prize, Winsor & Newton Oil Painters Award 2013; and the Janet Konstam Travel Award in 2007.

What level is the course and do I need any particular skills?

This course is ideal for all levels.

How will I be taught, and what feedback and support will I get?

Your experienced tutor will support you throughout the course in both group sessions and one-to-one support providing daily feedback, critique and constructive advice. Each course ends in a final round up session and should you wish for any specific feedback or support, please speak with your tutor at the start of your course.

When I've finished, what course can I do next?

There are a variety of courses available as short courses over the Easter and the summer holidays, also a wide range of weekend and evening classes, such as Intermediate Painting, Painting the Human Figure, Saturday Open Life Class (this is a drop in class) and many sculpture, drawing and printmaking classes too.

If you have more time available, huge development can be made in your practice by attending one of our part time day classes in drawing and painting, or our certificate programme. Please see all the options available on our web site.

Are there any other costs? What else should I bring each lesson?

The Academy is a white spirit and turpentine free environment and only odourless spirits, such as Zest-it or Sansodor, are permitted on the premises. Students must provide their own spirits, which can be recycled for longevity.

We request that you bring 2 small jars (one with a lid, one without) to hold your spirit, and a few cloths rags for brush cleaning (such as an old cotton t-shirt).

You will need to bring your own painting materials to the class, which you can store at The Art Academy for the duration of the course. If you do not have your own materials, we recommend you order an **Oil Painting Pack** at the time of booking, which will be available when you arrive for your first class. There is also a mini shop in the studio that supplies the basics such as canvas boards, paints, Zest-it etc. (cash purchases only).

An **Oil Painting Pack** (£50.00) contains:

A set of bristle brushes, both flat and round, suitable for either oils or acrylics

One tear off palette (9"x12")

One palette knife

One bottle Zest-it (250ml)

One 10"x 12" canvas board

One 10"x 14" canvas board

6 Daler Rowney (*Georgian*) oil tubes: Titanium White, Cadmium Yellow, Alizarin Crimson, Cadmium Red, French Ultramarine and Burnt Umber

Daily breakdown

Courses at the Art Academy offer a structured approach to ensure specific subjects, skills and methods are covered. Below is a daily breakdown of what will be covered. Please bear in mind that these classes will move with the pace of the class so a degree of flexibility of what will be covered on which day will be employed.

Day	Dates	Topic/skills covered	Location & Tutor	What to bring	Model
1	7th Aug	<p>The course starts with a short intro about the use of equipment and materials, and then there will be several warm up drawing and a brief look at how one would go about starting a portrait.</p> <p>We then move on to painting the figure in a limited colour palette. The main focus is on the use light and dark (Tone).</p>	Studio 3 James Bland	Oils - brushes & palette, canvas boards about 12" - 16" wide	Yes x2
2	8th Aug	Day two continues the focus on portraiture and introduces a colour palette of mainly red, blue and yellow. Colour mixing will be taught in relation to this. The aim is to do one oil painting from the model.	Studio 3 James Bland	One canvas or canvas board	Yes x2
3	9th Aug	This session involves shorter but more intense poses using the whole figure, the idea being to get students to develop their ideas for figure painting compositions and paint with more fluency and confidence. There will be three poses in the morning and two in the afternoon.	Studio 3 James Bland	A range of canvases and canvas boards	Yes x1
4	10th Aug	Commencing a two-day pose. The idea is to give students more time and the opportunity to push their painting towards a conclusion. (Students do not have to stick to the same painting over the two days if they do not want to.)	Studio 3 James Bland	A good-quality canvas at least 16" across	Yes x1
5	11th Aug	<p>Continue with the figure painting started on day 3. For those who prefer the shorter one-day pose can start a new painting, possibly a portrait.</p> <p>Lastly, reflecting on the course.</p>	Studio 3 James Bland	As above	Yes x1

Refreshments & Facilities

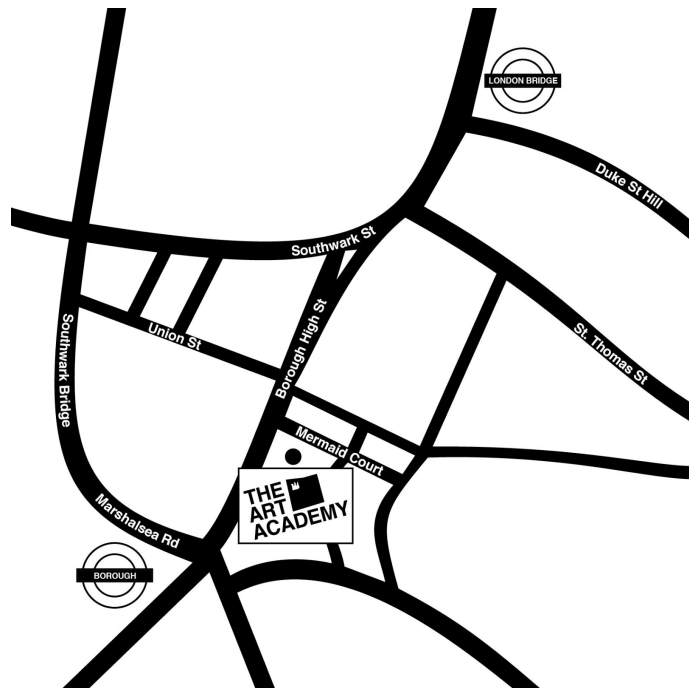
All students have access to the common room located in the Barn, on the ground floor of the Mermaid Court building. Here you will have use of a fridge, kettle, microwave and eating area.
