What is this course about?

This is a fun course that offers the fantastic opportunity to paint in and around London's urban landscape. The Art Academy is just a short stroll from the Thames, conveniently situated in the historic Southwark London Bridge area which will feature as the main focus of this course. Working with quick sketches in oil or acrylic, students will practice how to efficiently and accurately capture tone and colour in the outdoors. Creating loose and vigorous paintings, we will look at how to capture a sense of light and atmosphere at different times of day. Looking at the works of other artists we will discuss different ways of composing a painting in an urban setting. Basic painting techniques such as tone, colour and texture will be addressed, as well as creative expression in the application of paint. Painting outside of the studio is always an exciting experience and students of all levels are sure to enjoy painting outdoors.

What topics do we cover?

- Develop visual observation
- Organising your materials when working outside
- Painting line, tone and shape
- Arranging effective composition
- Colour mixing and palette discipline
- How to simplify and select subject
- Capturing a sense of light and atmosphere

By the end of this course you will:

Create a series of painterly oil sketches, as well as more developed paintings from a variety of different places, generating lots of enthusiasm to carry on painting.

About your tutor

David Caldwell is a London based Painter. He trained at the Glasgow School of Art and the Royal Drawing School. He has exhibited extensively nationwide and abroad and has won several major prizes for painting. He has previously been shortlisted for The BP Portrait Award, The Threadneedle Prize, The Lynn Painter Stainers Prize, The ING Discerning Eye,

The Seven Investments Management Award, The W. Gordon Smith Award and the Ruth Borchard Self Portrait Prize. David is an experienced 'plein air' painter and the Thames is a favourite subject. To see examples of his work visit www.davidjcalldwell.co.uk

What level is the course and do I need any particular skills?

This course is ideal for all levels.

How will I be taught, and what feedback and support will I get?

Your experienced tutor will support you throughout the course in both group sessions and one-to-one support providing daily feedback, critique and constructive advice. Each course ends in a final round up session and should you wish for any specific feedback or support, please speak with your tutor at the start of your course.

When I've finished, what course can I do next?

There are a variety of courses available as short courses over the Easter and the Summer holidays, also a wide range of weekend and evening classes, such as Intermediate Painting, Drawing for Beginners and Saturday Open Life Class (this is a drop in class).

If you have more time available, huge development can be made in your practice by attending one of our part time day classes in drawing and painting, or our certificate or diploma programmes. Please see all the options available on our web site.

Are there any other costs? What else should I bring each lesson?

You will need to bring your painting materials to the class. Please note that when painting outdoors, being organized with your materials and tools is essential. Make sure you bring everything listed below to the class.

- A selection of paints (either acrylics or oils)
- A selection of brushes
- Palette (wooden, plastic or tear-off are all fine)
- For oil paints - only odourless spirits such as Sansodor or Zest-it
- Rags or paper towels
- Jars with lids for water or spirits
- Carrier bags for messy brushes and rags
- Masking tape
- Clothes suitable for painting (old clothes or an apron are recommended)
- Small sketch book and pencils
- Canvases, canvas boards or primed wooden boards of small/medium sizes*
- Sunhat + suncream
- Drinking water

*It is a good idea to bring two of each size, as these can be taped together in order to transport wet paintings back to the studio. Canvas boards are also available to buy from a mini shop in the studio should this be needed at any point.

Primed paper for oil and acrylic painting is also recommended however transportation of wet paintings should be considered carefully.

Lunch is not provided.

Optional:

- Painting medium
- Palette knife
- Wet wipes
- Fold up travel easel or box easel (if you have one)
- Light weight fold out stool
- Packed lunch

The Academy is a white spirit and turpentine free environment and only odourless spirits, such as Zest-it or Sansodor, are permitted on the premises. Students must provide their own spirits, which can be recycled for longevity.

You will need to bring your own painting materials to the class, which you can store at The Art Academy for the duration of the course. If you do not have your own materials, we recommend you order an **Oil Painting Pack** or **Acrylic Painting Pack** at the time of booking, which will be available when you arrive for your first class. *Please note this is a standard pack and does not contain everything David has listed above.* There is also a mini shop in the studio that supplies the basics such as canvas boards, paints, Zest-it etc. (cash purchases only).

Daily breakdown


