What is this course about?

Masterclasses are a special feature of The Art Academy. Drawing on our extensive professional network we are able to source expert, sought-after practitioners to teach classes - people who are masters in their field. This five day figure painting course will offer an opportunity for intensive study under the tuition of Alan McGowan. Students will work from life models each day to develop expressive paintings of the nude. This course is designed to help the student further develop their skills in painting the figure whilst also enabling an increase in the expressive aspects of their painting skills.

Under Alan's guidance, students will concentrate on developing the relationship between life drawing and painting whilst considering mark-making, colour and the handling properties of paint. These elements will be fused together over the five day course by firstly making several drawn studies in both dry materials and oil paints, followed by a one day oil painting and finally, a more developed three day painting in oil. The consideration of accuracy of observation and measurement will be looked at in relation to freedom of expression, exploration of materials and engagement with an expressive and individual painterly language. Students will receive regular one-to-one guidance throughout the course.

What topics do we cover?

- Approaches to drawing and how they might influence our painting
- The foundational role of tonal values
- Painting and drawing expressively

- Colour mixing especially of flesh and shadows
- Consideration of composition

By the end of this course you will:

Have developed your knowledge of drawing, tone, colour and expressive use of paint; have completed one shorter and one longer nude life painting and a number of briefer sketches and studies.

What level is the course and do I need any particular skills?

This course is for intermediate and advanced students as a basic competence in oil painting is essential. Masterclasses are designed for people with some experience who wish to develop further their art practice. Teaching groups are deliberately small (13 students), with intense tuition and personalised guidance. This is a valuable opportunity for more experienced painters to study painting under the guidance of an established artist.

How will I be taught, and what feedback and support will I get?

Your experienced tutor will support you throughout the course in both group sessions and one-to-one support providing daily feedback, critique and constructive advice. Each course ends in a final round up session and should you wish for any specific feedback or support, please speak with your tutor at the start of your course.

About your Tutor

Alan McGowan is a figurative and portrait artist who specialises in working from life. His expressive brushwork and dynamic use of colour in combination with accomplished draughtsmanship have won him many honours including exhibiting at the BP Portrait exhibition at the National Portrait Gallery in London, the Threadneedle Prize for Figurative Art, the Society of Portrait Sculptors exhibition and The Ruth Borchard self portrait exhibition. In 2014 he was a semi-finalist in the Sky Arts Portrait Artist of the year and his work is featured in the international painting annual review INPA5, published in 2016 by Manifest in Cincinatti USA.

He has taught at a number of art institutions including the National Portrait Gallery London, The Royal Hibernian Academy in Dublin and Edinburgh College of Art. He has exhibited widely in the UK, regularly at the Royal Scottish Academy, and in New York, Lisbon, Helsinki, South Korea and Prague, and his work appears in several public collections including that of the Royal Scottish Academy and Stirling University.

In 2012 he published a book of life drawings titled *The Language of the Body*.

When I've finished, what course can I do next?

There are a variety of courses available as short courses over the Easter and the Summer holidays, also a wide range of evening classes, such as Intermediate Painting, Portrait Painting, Saturday Open Life Class, Life Drawing etc.

Are there any other costs? What else should I bring each lesson?

The Academy is a white spirit and turpentine free environment and only odourless spirits, such as Zest-it or Sansodor, are permitted on the premises. Students must provide their own spirits, which can be recycled for longevity. We request that you bring 2 small jars

(one with a lid, one without) to hold your spirit, and a few cloths rags for brush cleaning (such as an old cotton t-shirt).

You will need to bring your own painting materials to the class, which you can store at The Art Academy for the duration of the course. If you do not have your own materials, we recommend you order an **Oil Painting Pack** at the time of booking, which will be available when you arrive for your first class.* There is also a mini shop in the studio that supplies the basics such as canvas boards, paints, Zest-it etc. (cash purchases only).

Recomended materials from Alan:

- Odorless spirits, Zest-it or Sansodor
- 1 jar with lid to put your odorless solvent in
- 1 jar without lid
- Kitchen roll and a couple of cloth rags.
- Paper; 2 white cartridge and 3 coloured (buff, brown or coloured mid-toned).
 Canvases/primed boards to include one at between A3 and A2 for one day painting and (approximate size), one at A2 to A1 for three day painting (approximate size) and one extra (any size) just in case.
- Palette
- Brushes: a range of square ended bristle brushes (small to large). One large flat (1.5/2 inches) would be useful.
- A palette knife
- An old shirt or apron
- Students should bring their own oil paints, below is a list of colours that Tim uses:
 - Titanium white
 - Zinc White
 - o Raw Sienna
 - Yellow Ochre
 - Spectrum Yellow
 - o Burnt Sienna
 - Alizarin Crimson
 - Spectrum Red
 - o Ultramarine Blue
 - Prussian Blue
 - Venetian Red/Indian Red
 - Paynes Grey
 - Raw Umber

One tear off palette (9"x12")

Please follow signs for Borough High Street to exit. Please <u>click here</u> for a map.


Just moments walk from the Thames; The Art Academy is also ideally located for access to: White Cube Tate Modern Jerwood Gallery
