What is this course about?

Young Artists is an exciting five day course for ages 12-14 providing high level art tuition, including drawing workshops, contemporary painting, specialist sculpture techniques, and using experimental media. Focused classes create a supportive environment, and there is a strong focus on personal outcomes and solutions to develop independent judgement. Access to specialist materials and facilities improve technical skills, and discussion and presentation sessions build confidence and critical understanding. This course is ideal for those studying a range of arts based GCSE subjects, or wanting to advance their artistic skills and creative confidence.

What topics do we cover?

- How to use a range of exciting drawing techniques and experiment with materials such as charcoal and chalk
- Key skills for painting the figure, how to plan the composition, mix colour, approach the body and depict volume
- Using mixed media and collage, understanding abstract approaches
- Learning new sculptural techniques such as clay figure sculpture
- Taking an artwork through from concept to completion, and discussing and presenting ideas and artworks

By the end of this course you will: Have completed an intensive and exciting five days, learning a host of new skills within an art college environment, with a completed artwork from your personal project, and a series of paintings, drawings, and sculptural pieces.

What level is the course and do I need any particular skills?

The course is for 12-14 year-olds, ideal for those studying creative subjects or with a passion for art.

How will I be taught, and what feedback and support will I get?

Your tutors are highly experienced and will support you throughout the course, in group sessions and with one-to-one support and advice. Critique and constructive advice will help develop your ideas and how to discuss and present them. Your tutors will give you lots of feedback, help you document your progress on the course, and give you a final feedback session at the end of the course.

Are there any other costs? What else should I bring each lesson?

Please bring old clothes and two jam jars or containers for water. Please also bring a camera/phone to

photo document your work.

Preparation for the Personal Project day: Students should bring in a range of images of a place, object, or concept, that excites and inspires them, to help develop their personal project.

Daily breakdown

Courses at the Art Academy offer a structured approach to ensure specific subjects, skills and methods are covered. Below is a weekly breakdown of what will be covered. Bear in mind that these classes will move with the pace of the class so a degree of flexibility of what will be covered on which day will be employed.

Day	Dates	Topic/skills covered	Location	What to bring	Model
1	3 April	<p>Fundamental skills of drawing and painting</p> <p>The week will begin with an introduction to the fundamentals of drawing and painting, including line, tone, and gesture. Students will explore colour, composition, and paint application through a still life painting, followed by a creative painting session which introduces music and movement. The tutor will discuss with each student individually to determine their specific interests and goals for the course.</p>	Studio 4	n/a	no
2	4 April	<p>Painting the figure</p> <p>Starting with a discussion of the body in art, students will develop a full painting of the life model. Students will learn key skills to observe and depict the figure, along with basic anatomy, and composition.</p>	Studio 4	n/a	yes
3	5 April	<p>Mixed media artwork</p> <p>Initial slide show of different artists who use contemporary mixed media approaches including collage and installation. Students will then explore the building to collect interesting rubbings and textures for a creative piece, starting with small pieces incorporating collage, texture and colour. In the afternoon, students will use the artworks and materials collected to create 2D or 3D mixed media pieces. This will all be with a view to developing a final project on the last day.</p>	Studio 4	n/a	no
4	6 April	<p>Clay figure sculpture. The day starts with an introduction to the principles of figure sculpture. Students will then learn how to model the figure using either relief sculpture, plaster assemblage, or portrait sculpture.</p>	Studio 4	n/a	yes

5	7 April	Personal Projects day. On the final day, students will work on translating their ideas and interests gathered over the week into a finished artwork. Students will consolidate the techniques and skills they have learnt, and choose the most appropriate artistic language with which to develop their concept into a quality finished work that they can present and discuss. 
If you would like to make the most of the area a member of the team will be happy to advise you on areas of interest locally.
