What is this course about?

This is a well-structured and systematic course for those who have never painted before or want to reassess their approach to painting. Students learn to see colour, shape and tone, and to relate all these elements together in compositions. This course aims to foster self-confidence and enjoyment of painting in a stimulating environment. Working through a series of exercises you will gain experience and skills in painting still life, self portrait and using photography. Whilst also exploring a more creative approach to painting, helping you establish your own style and identity. This course is a creative and fun experience, offering plenty of guidance from the tutor.

What topics do we cover?

- Principles of tone, handling highlight, mid-tone and shadow
- Understanding and mixing colour
- Looking at the importance of composition in a painting.
- How to get texture with acrylics and effects that can be created.
- Self portraits/human face.
- Working from 3D.
- Working from 2D, creating personal imagery.

By the end of this course you will: have a good understanding of the basic techniques in painting. Be able to competently mix colours and identify tone. Set up a strong composition. Have the confidence to undertake paintings alone. Have a selection of paintings to take home.

About your tutor

Carl Randall is a graduate of The Slade of Fine Art (BA, Painting), The Royal Drawing School, (the Drawing Year), and Tokyo University of Fine Arts (MA & Doctorate, Fine Art). He is a previous winner of The Sunday Times Watercolour Competition and the 2012 BP Travel Award from The National Portrait Gallery, where he had a display of 16 paintings made in Japan. He has exhibited with various galleries, including Christies New York, several times at The BP Portrait Awards, The Royal Academy of Art Summer Exhibition, The Jerwood Drawing Prize, and The Royal Society of Portrait Painters at The Mall Galleries; and in Switzerland, Japan, Istanbul and Taiwan. His book 'Japan Catalogues' is on sale at The National Portrait Gallery, London. In 2014 he had three solo exhibitions - at The Daiwa Anglo Japanese Foundation in London; The Berloni Gallery, London; and

The Shizuoka City Hiroshige Tokaido Museum in Japan. He lived in Japan for 10 years as an artist. He has work in the collections of UCL Museum, Fondation Carmignac Paris, Tokyo University of Arts, and The Royal Collection (commissioned by HRH Prince of Wales).

What level is the course and do I need any particular skills?

The course is for beginners, so no previous experience is necessary and is ideal for those who are looking to build confidence in their painting.

How will I be taught, and what feedback and support will I get?

Your experienced tutor will support you throughout the course in both group sessions and one-to-one support providing regular feedback, critique and constructive advice. Each course ends in a final round up session and should you wish for any specific feedback or support, please speak with your tutor at the start of your course.

When I've finished, what course can I do next?

There are a variety of courses available as short courses over the Easter and the Summer holidays, also a wide range of evening classes, such as Intermediate Painting, Introduction to Oils, Painting for Beginners - the expressive approach, Saturday Open Life Class (this is a drop in class) or figure sculpture etc.

If you have more time available huge development can be made in your practice by attending one of our part time day classes in sculpture or the sculpture certificate programme. Please see all the options available on our web site.

Are there any other costs? What else should I bring?

If you do not have your own painting materials, we recommend you order an **Acrylic Painting Pack** at the time of booking which will be available when you arrive for your first class.

An **Acrylic Painting Pack** (£50.00) contains:

A set of bristle brushes, both flat and round, suitable for acrylics

One tear off palette (9"x12")

One palette knife

One 10" x 12" canvas board

One 10" x 14" canvas board

8 Daler Rowney acrylic tubes: black, white, cadmium red, ultramarine, sap green, yellow ochre, burnt umber, cadmium yellow

Daily breakdown

Courses at the Art Academy offer a structured approach to ensure specific subjects, skills and methods are covered. Below is a daily breakdown of what will be covered. Bear in mind that these classes will move with the pace of the class so a degree of flexibility of what will be covered on which day will be employed.

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1	21 Jan	Still Life - Tone Painting a still life using tones of grey/black & white, focusing on light and shade.	Studio 4	Old clothes, small canvas brushes, pallet, pallet knife, Paints: Black and White paints.	No
2	28 Jan	Still Life - Colour Painting still life objects using colour, practicing what was learnt about tone in the previous week.	Studio 4	Old clothes, all painting materials.	No
3	04 Feb	Still Life - Underpainting (1/2) 2 week coloured still life painting. The practise of tonal 'underpainting' is taught.	Studio 4	Old Clothes, all painting materials.	No
4	11 Feb	Still Life - Glazing. (2/2) 2 week coloured still life painting. The practise of 'glazing' is taught, using painting made in previous week. Introduction to colour mixing.	Studio 4	Old Clothes, all painting materials.	No
5	18 Feb	Colour/Texture/Paint application. Discovering how to get different textures using paint mediums - experimental painting looking at the properties of paint, and the variety of effects that can be produced.	Studio 4	Old clothes, all painting materials	No
6	25 Feb	Self Portrait (1/3) Do a three week self portrait. Look at designing a painting and look at other artist work for inspiration. Work out composition in this lesson.	Studio 4	Old clothes, all painting materials	No
7	04 Mar	Self Portrait (2/3) Continuation of three week self portrait. Apply large areas of colour/tone in this lesson.	Studio 4	Old clothes, all painting materials	No
8	11 Mar	Self Portrait (3/3) Continuation of three week self portrait. Work on smaller areas in this lesson, finishing off.	Studio 4	Old clothes, all painting materials	No

9	18 Mar	Photographs In this session students will be asked to bring in an images that they would like to paint. The class will look at how to work from photos to create a more personal painting.	Studio 4	Photos/images to work from. Old clothes, all painting materials	No
10	25 Mar	Photographs Continue and finish the painting started in the previous week.	Studio 4	Photos/images to work from. Old clothes, Drawing and painting materials	No


