What is this course about?

A structured and systematic course for those who have never painted before and for those who want to reinforce their basic oil skills or to move on to using oil paints having used acrylics or water-based media. Students learn to see colour, shape and tone, and to relate these elements together in compositions with access to a life model. This course aims will nurture self-confidence and enjoyment of painting in a stimulating, fun and relaxing environment. It is an ideal course for beginners as there is plenty of guidance from the tutor.

What topics do we cover?

- Lay out a basic palette
- Working with a limited tonal palette
- Handling paint
- Laying down a tonal ground
- Drawing out and under-painting
- Glazing and paint mediums
- Understanding colour and mixing
- Understanding composition
- How to take a painting to completion

By the end of this course you will: understand how to use oil paints. Be able to undertake painting alone. Understand how to mix colours, and have a good understanding of colour theory. Have an understanding of tone, composition, handling paint, and more. Have a number of paintings to take home.

About your tutor

Eigil Nordstrom is a Norwegian painter currently based in London. He studied with Peter Sutton in Norway, and Hans-Peter Szameit in Sweden, before completing the Diploma in Painting at The Art Academy, where he was the Wolfendale Patron's Prize winner of 2011. He has a wide experience in teaching drawing and painting, and has exhibited both in the UK and Norway since graduating with an MA in Fine Art from the City & Guilds of London Art School. Recent awards include the ArtGemini Prize 2014 and the Art Clubs Charitable Trust Award at the NEAC 2014.

What level is the course and do I need any particular skills?

The course is for beginners, so no previous experience is necessary and is ideal for those who are looking to build confidence in their painting.

How will I be taught, and what feedback and support will I get?

Your experienced tutor will support you throughout the course in both group sessions and one-to-one support providing regular feedback, critique and constructive advice. Each course ends in a final round up session and should you wish for any specific feedback or support, please speak with your tutor at the start of your course.

When I've finished, what course can I do next?

There are a variety of courses available as short courses over the Easter and the Summer holidays, also a wide range of evening classes, such as Intermediate Painting, Portrait Painting, Saturday Open Life Class, Life Drawing etc.

If you have more time available huge development can be made in your practice by attending one of our part time day classes in sculpture or the sculpture certificate programme. Please see all the options available on our web site.

Are there any other costs? What else should I bring each week?

The Academy is a white spirit free environment only odorless spirits, such as Zest-it or Sansodor, are permitted on the premises for oil classes. We recommend that you bring a jar with a lid to store your odorless solvent in.

Everyone needs to bring with them:

1 jar with lid (old jam jar)

A few cloth rags

You will need to bring your own painting materials to the class, which you can store at The Art Academy for the duration of the course. If you do not have your own materials, we recommend you order an **Oil Painting Pack** at the time of booking which will be available when you arrive for your first class. There is a mini shop in the studio that supplies the basics such as canvas boards, paints, Zest-it etc.

An **Oil Painting Pack** (£50.00) contains:

A set of bristle brushes, both flat and round, suitable for either oils or acrylics.

One tear off palette (9"x12").

One palette knife.

One bottle Zest-it (250ml)

One 10"x 12" canvas board

One 10"x 14" canvas board

Two 12"x 16" canvas boards

6 Daler Rowney oil tubes: Titanium White, Cadmium Yellow, Alizarin Crimson, Cadmium Red, French Ultramarine and Burnt Umber.

Daily breakdown


Location
