

What is this course about?

This course gives students with their own Digital SLR the chance to learn how to properly use it over 3 weeks. Your experienced tutor will guide you step by step through the functions on your individual camera model and how you can move away from auto modes in order to create stunning, professional looking images. Students will learn about Aperture, Shutter Speed, ISO, File types and everything else you need to get a quality exposure in a variety of environments. The course will teach you about the technical nature of photography as well as how to compose better images. If you have found it frustrating trying to get the most out of your Digital SLR this great value course is the solution you have been after.

What topics do we cover?

Through a variety of practical and theoretical exercises we will explore the manual settings of the camera and learn how to create good exposures in different conditions by controlling aperture, shutter speed, and ISO. You will be introduced to the basic rules of composition to enable you to take professional looking images and also gain an understanding of the use of different file types, metering modes and other technical settings that can enhance your photography. We will also cover the basics of post-production techniques towards the end of the course using Photoshop CC 2014. You will be given assignments each week for the following class.

By the end of this course you will:

Fully understand all aspects of your camera and be able to take well composed and correctly exposed images in a variety of environments; you will essentially never want to shoot in full automatic mode again.

What level is the course and do I need any particular skills?

This course is suitable for beginners, no previous knowledge is required.

How will I be taught, and what feedback and support will I get?

Your experienced tutor will support you throughout the course in both group sessions and one-to-one support providing feedback and constructive advice. Should you wish for any specific feedback or support, please speak with your tutor at the start of your course.

When I've finished, what course can I do next?

Are there any other costs? What else should I bring each week?

You **must** bring your own digital SLR camera to class for every session as this course is designed to teach students how to use their own cameras: some hybrid compact cameras are also suitable. However, many small point and shoot compact cameras lack the functionality required. Before booking, please ensure your camera has manual exposure control and the ability to shoot JPEG and RAW files (it doesn't matter if it has a fixed or interchangeable lens). Students are also advised to bring a USB memory stick with them to backup their work. Though there will be the possibility of storing files on the computers we cannot take responsibility for the safe keeping of these files.


